U. S. Places 'Phantom' Orders for War Goods

NEW YORK, Sept. 30 (AP)—"Phantom orders" for war goods already have been placed with American manufacturers—to be filled only in case of armed conflict.

PARIS, Oct. 1 (AP)—Twelve countries are about to form a Middle Eastern bloc in the United Nations, reliable informants said today.

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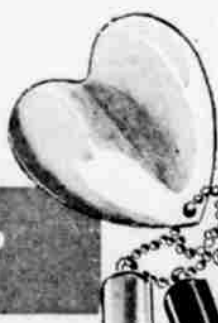
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
