LOUISVILLE, Ky., Oct. 1—(AP)—President Truman last night urged united action in support of the annual Community Chest campaign to meet a national goal of \$184,000,000.

He spoke over a nationwide hookup of major radio networks, asking the nation to support the campaign in a "practical demonstration of the democratic faith we profess."

Price of Ford Coupes Cut, Upped on Sedans

DETROIT, Oct. 1—(AP)—The Ford Motor Company announced today a price decrease of \$15 on Ford club coupes and a \$15 increase in the price of tudor sedans.

Vice President J. R. Davis said the adjustment in prices is effective immediately and applies to all of the standard and custom models. Prices of other models remain unchanged.

Four Areas to Vote On Annexation to Portland

PORTLAND, Oct. 1—(AP)—Voters in Portland and four adjoining areas will ballot in the November election on whether to annex the four areas to the city.

The largest area is the Home Water District, which includes the business district of Multnomah. Others are the Bertha Water District; the Hessler Tract; and Sellwood Gardens.

Communists Barred From Georgia Ballot

ATLANTA, Ga., Sept. 30—(AP)—The Georgia House passed 152 to 0 today a bill clearing the general election ballot to all candidates for President except Communists.

The measure, also approved by the Senate, goes to Governor M. E. Thompson for his signature. Thompson has indicated he would approve the bill.
