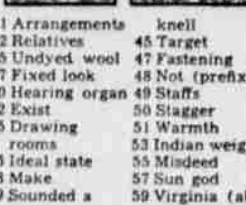

Extra Try Urged To Exceed Goal For New Hospital

Earl Wiley, vice chairman, Douglas Community Hospital building fund campaign, today called for extra effort on the part of all volunteer workers "in these last few days to put us well over our minimum goal of \$300,000." General Chairman H. O. Partridge will be out of town during the remainder of the campaign.

All division and group chairmen, salesmen, and captains and majors will make their third progress reports at the final report luncheon tomorrow noon in the Civic Room of the Umpqua Hotel.

At the second report meeting last Friday, \$52,207 was reported bringing the total to \$237,297.

"We all know the need for additional hospital beds and more medical facilities in this area. Our minimum hospital bed requirements today call for 146 beds. We can go a long way toward overcoming that shortage by contributing to the long range program of Douglas Community Hospital, Inc.," Wiley added.

He said that "all volunteers have done a splendid job to date, and we need just a little more effort now to close the campaign and make it the greatest and most successful civic project in Douglas County's history."
