More than 140 volunteers of the Women's Residential Division of the \$300,000 Douglas Community Hospital Building Fund Campaign will have a victory tea in the First Presbyterian Church on Kane and Lane Streets Friday afternoon, Mrs. Benjamin DuFresne, chairman, announced today.

Mrs. L. G. Twohy, chairman of the tea, said the program will open at 2 p. m. and continue till 4 o'clock. She will be assisted by Mrs. Vern Keel and Mrs. Scott Layman, who will serve refreshments; Mrs. A. G. Henninger, in charge of table arrangements, and Mrs. Roy E. Hanford, in charge of the program and entertainment.

Mrs. DuFresne, as division chairman, urged all women volunteers to clear up their projects "in the last few days of the campaign that means so much to all of us."

She pointed out that the Building Fund Campaign was nearing its minimum \$300,000 goal, necessary to build the 40-bed institution.

Campaign Vice Chairman Earl Wiley announced today that names of members of the Douglas Community Hospital Building Fund organization in Oakland, Rolliston Bridges is community chairman and is being assisted by Fred Hewitt, Ted Rohwer, Mrs. John Edwards, J.
