

## Renewal of Diplomatic Relations With Spain Strongly Advocated

U. S. Senator Chan Gurney, chairman of the Senate Armed Forces Committee, after conferring with Generalissimo Franco in Madrid, has called for restoration of "complete relations between Spain and the other great powers," including America.

## Reedsport Braves Edge North Bend Bulldogs, 13 to 12

NORTH BEND, Ore., Oct. 6.—The Reedsport Braves beat the North Bend Bulldogs by one fat point—13 to 12—on the Bulldogs' home gridiron Saturday night, Oct. 2.

The first score was made in the first quarter by the Braves, when Banta, fullback, went over center for 15 yards to make the touchdown. The conversion attempt failed. Within four minutes following the first score, Banta again carried the pigskin over, racing 30 yards to cross the double line. Reedsport was called off-side and the score was not counted, ending first quarter 6 to 0, in favor of the Braves.

## Cominform Discusses Stand in Event of War

BERLIN, Oct. 6 (AP)—The American military government's official German newspaper said today a meeting of the Communist International Information Bureau (Cominform) was held recently in Dessau, in the Soviet zone of Germany.

German Communist leaders participated in the meeting. Die Neue Zeitung said.

One of the major items on the Cominform agenda, the newspaper said, was "the attitude of the Cominform in the event of an open conflict."

## Navy Day Proclaimed By President Truman

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6 (AP)—President Truman yesterday proclaimed October 27 as Navy Day. The event will honor the achievements of the men and women who make up the nation's sea strength.

Mr. Truman directed that the flag be displayed on government buildings and asked the people to display the flag at their homes. He also directed that all Navy ships and stations, where practicable, be open to public visits and that all ships of the Navy "dress ship" on that day.

## Court Keeps Senate Candidate on Ballot

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6 (AP)—The Supreme Court refused yesterday to throw out an order putting the name of Lyndon B. Johnson on the Texas election ballot as the Democratic candidate for the U. S. Senate.

Justice Black issued the order on September 28. It lifted an injunction restraining the Texas secretary of state from having Johnson's name placed on the ballot.

Attorneys for former Texas

Governor Coke Stevenson, Johnson's opponent in a close runoff primary election, requested the High Court to throw out Black's orders.

The Supreme Court yesterday announced that the request had been denied. It said the decision was reached during a conference attended by all the justices except Murphy, who is undergoing treatment in Michigan.

Congress authorized the Secretary of the Treasury to mint three-cent pieces during the war, but none was minted.

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
