Salem's Council Asks 4-Lane Highway Route

SALEM, Oct. 12 (AP)—The Salem City Council asked the State Highway Commission last night to establish a four-lane route on the Pacific Highway on North Capitol Street in Salem. The council said the route carries 16,000 cars a day, causing severe congestion. It asked that

the four-lane route be created immediately.

The four blocks from the State Capitol buildings to Union Street would be widened from 40 to 80 feet. From Union to the northern section of the city, a distance of about a mile, the four-lane road would be accomplished by prohibiting all parking.

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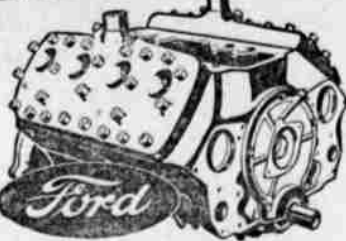
