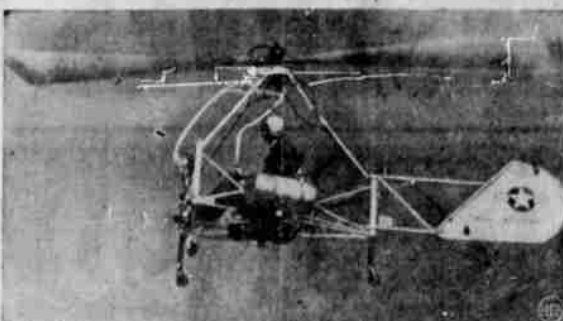

I have not had time since receiving your demand to check all these items, but in so far as I have checked, the same have all been reported and the amounts paid. The same is true relating to fines remitted to State of Oregon in error and returned by State to Justice. As I pointed out before, one item of \$2.40 in the Guthrie case is not payable to the county, but if it has not been paid it would be payable to the State of Oregon and I have written the Treasurer concerning the same.

I believe that all amounts due the county have been reported and paid. I therefore insist that you have the auditor bring his audit up to date and that I be permitted to work with him.

I also insist that the auditor continue to check my books and records with me to the end that the same may be completed with the close of my term of office in order that I may turn over all moneys to my successor and have a complete clearance. I am, entitled to this.
