ected recently has been Wellington, where 40 cases were reported in two weeks. Confirmed cases in Wellington since November 1947, total 181. In Auckland there have been 230 cases in the same period.

South Umpqua Dam to Provide Boating Favored

Construction of a dam of the South Umpqua River to create a lake for boating at Umpqua Park and other suggestions for recreational improvements, were contained in questionnaires returned to the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce recently by its members.

To date 115 members have expressed "definite ideas" for civic improvements here, according to the Chamber of Commerce Bulletin issued today.

Suggestions pertaining to Umpqua Park include the proposed construction of a bridge to serve that area, public ownership of river frontage between Umpqua Park and Kiwanis Park for recreation, and construction of the dam, which would have "proper fish escapement provided."

Other suggestions include construction of a civic auditorium, municipal ownership of the water system, removal of telephone and power poles from Jackson and Cass streets in the business district, and more traffic control lights in congested areas.

Other tabulated replies to suggestions offered in the questionnaire include:

Favor additional school facilities, 81 by bond issue, 14 by special tax levy; favor new street lights, 50 by bond issue, 40 by special tax levy; favor street improvements, 66 by bond issue, 23 by special tax levy; favor storm sewers, 62 by bond issue, 24 by special tax levy; favor city hall expansion, 32 by bond issue, 26 by special tax levy; favor airport improvements, 65 by bond issue, 12 by special tax levy; favor city-owned parking lots, 44 by bond issue, 13 by special tax levy.

Forty three persons expressed themselves as favoring the use

Traffic Danger Highest in Country

Pedestrians now are more likely to be killed in the country than in the city, Secretary of State Newberry has reminded rural and suburban dwellers.

Accident records for the first six months show that 19 out of 40 pedestrians killed in traffic met death in rural or unincorporated areas. Considering the much greater number of city pedestrians, the danger in each individual case is obviously higher in the country, the safety official pointed out.

Most dangerous action of the rural pedestrian is crossing a highway. Failure to judge the speed of approaching cars accurately is one of the principal reasons for these fatalities. For each yard a pedestrian walks, a car travelling 50 miles per hour will go 15 yards, Newberry said. City dwellers usually do not have to cope with such high speeds.

Three out of every four pedestrians killed in the first six months were under 15 or over 60 years of age. The secretary urged parents to assist in teaching safe walking habits to children, and urged drivers to remember school hours and drive carefully near school grounds and crossings.

1 of 5 Survives Wreck of Barge

SEATTLE, Oct. 19—(AP)—The pilot of the gale-torn power barge Skarstone waited rescue today on a beach 22 miles west of Cape Yakutat, Alaska.

Four other crewmen who abandoned the vessel when its seams opened during a weekend storm are feared dead.

The lone survivor is G. A. Skarbo of Seattle. A bush pilot from Yakutat, 100 miles east of the grounded barge, plans to pick him off the beach when the weather clears. Winds drove the craft shore yesterday.

On a walkie-talkie dropped by a rescue plane, Skarbo told how his companions, fearing the Skarstone would sink, went over the side and were lost when their dory swamped in high waves.

The Cape Douglas Canning Corporation, operators of the 105-foot craft, identified the others as Capt. Byron P. Stone, 47, master; Hal Imbrie, engineer; and Keith Moore, a crewman, all of Seattle, and Jack Cunningham of Fort Townsend.

The barge was en route from Seattle to Anchorage with general cargo for strike-bound Alaska.

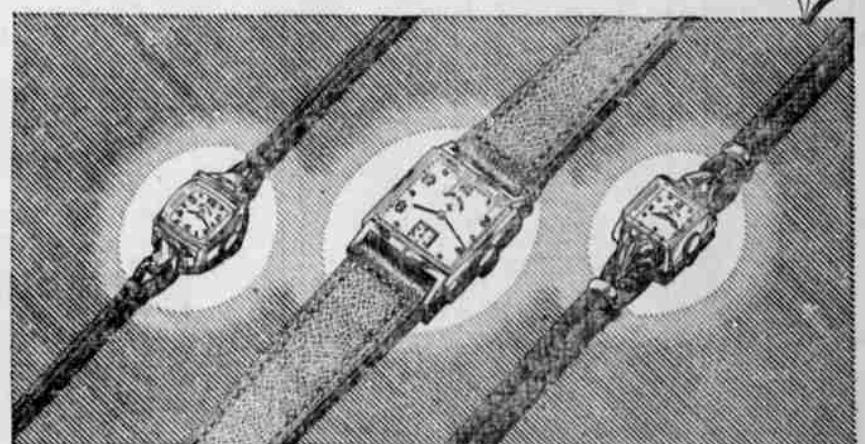

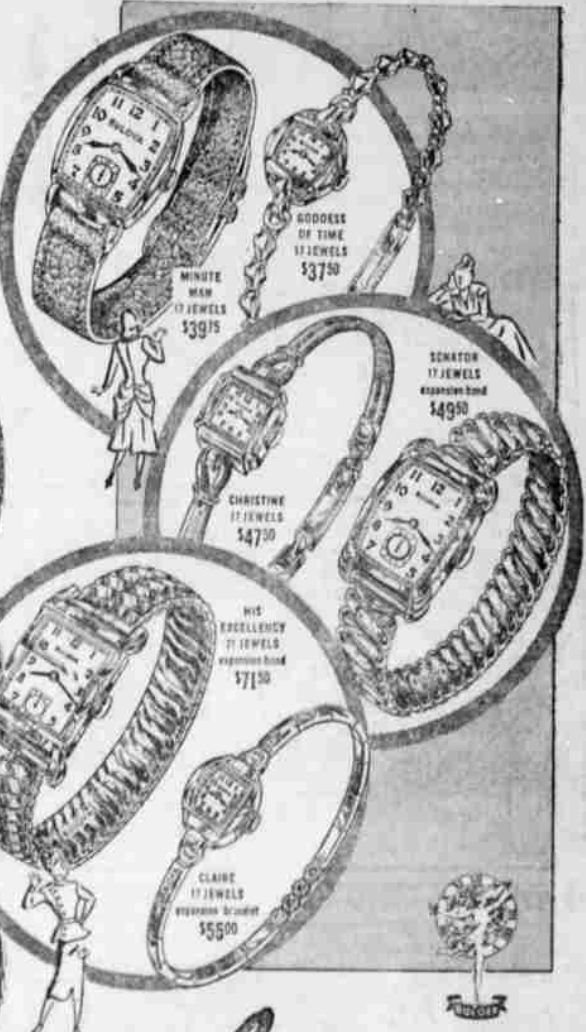
