

### Cottage Grove 11 Downs Roseburg Indians, 21 to 6

Dogged by hard luck and good opponents, Roseburg High dropped its third consecutive football game, this time to the Cottage Grove Lions by 21-6, in a Friday night game in Cottage Grove.

Three minutes after the initial kickoff, with Roseburg on their own goal line, Cottage Grove blocked a punt and safetied for their first two points. At the end of the first quarter it was the Lions with 2-0.

The first Cottage Grove touchdown came in the second period on an end run by Larry Anderson. Another end run in the same quarter put the score at 14-0.

A third end run in the third frame gave the Lions their final touchdown of the game. This time the conversion attempt was good for the 21st tally.

Roseburg's only score came in the third quarter. With the ball on the Cottage Grove 30, Bob Sanders heaved a pass to Dale Bonebrake who ran from the Lions' 10 to paydirt.

The last quarter went scoreless. Coach Cece Sherwood said of the Cottage Grovers, "They're the best team we've played since Medford."

### Instruction In Polio Cases Issued By Health Dept.

When any person has the symptoms of infantile paralysis, his family physician should be notified. The doctor will make a diagnosis and if the symptoms are those of polio he will make arrangements with the proper authorities to transfer the patient to a treatment center at Eugene or Portland.

This advice was given by the County Health Department today, following the report that a first grade pupil at Dillard School, eight miles south of here, was stricken with infantile paralysis, causing closure of the school.

Mrs. Mary Barrett, county public health nurse, said that health authorities generally feel that closing of schools is unnecessary where only one polio case is reported; that it is better to have the children in their classrooms than "running about," unattended.

In the case at Dillard, other children in the stricken child's family have been isolated, since they are the ones who were in direct contact with him. The child has been transferred to the Sacred Heart Hospital at Eugene and his case is reported to be "not severe." The isolation period for those in direct contact with polio cases is 14 days.

County Health Department authorities had not deemed the closure of the Dillard School of 306 pupils necessary, but the clo-
