Here are more notes of interest in regard to election returns the evening of November 2, beginning at 6:15 p.m.:

Mutual will make its election night headquarters in the ballroom of the Ritz-Carlton Hotel in New York. The full coast-to-coast facilities of Mutual, plus 16,000 miles of additional, specially-installed circuits, will be controlled from the Ritz ballroom after 7 p.m. EST on the evening of November 2nd. Here they will establish their vast tabulating center and it will become the hub for a world-wide presentation of election returns and information.

The British Broadcasting Corporation, the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, the French Broadcasting System, and two South American broadcasting systems, which are expected to fall in line between now and election day, will use the Curtis-Mutual facilities in broadcasting the United States election results throughout their world-wide systems. Every effort will be made too, to have the Mutual election results short-waved behind the iron curtain of Eastern Europe.

A special 15 minute coast-to-coast program will be staged by Mutual the night before election in which the weather experts from the U. S. Weather Bureau and several top cities of the country will give weather predictions for election day, plus statements concerning what happens in various communities with good weather, with bad weather, the expected number of voters to turn out under given conditions, etc.

There will be 73 special broadcasting crews, newsmen, announcers, and engineer teams who will be stationed in pivotal areas throughout the country. Microphones will constantly be with the leading candidates—President Truman, Governor Dewey, Henry Wallace, Governor Thurmond, and even Norman Thomas—to report their reactions as the votes come in.

Plot Investigator Now Under Charge, Himself

BANGKOK, Oct. 27.—(AP)—The police major general responsible for rounding up plotters in the unsuccessful coup d'etat of Oct. 6 was arrested yesterday as a suspected plotter himself. In an equally bizarre sequel to the failed attempt to seize the government another person suspected of implication in the plot

announced his candidacy for the national House of Representatives.

Taken into custody was Maj. Gen. Chamlien, chairman of the Plot Investigation Board. Chamlien was arrested because of alleged dealings with others rounded up as plot suspects. The candidate suspect is Lieut. Gen. Yutharak, former minister of the interior. He was taken to provincial headquarters under heavy guard and wearing handcuffs to file his papers for the candidacy.

New Freight Charge Hits California Fruit Men

FRESNO, Calif., Oct. 27.—(AP)—It will cost California fresh fruit and vegetable shippers about \$30 a car more in service charges to ship their produce to New York and Philadelphia after Nov. 1. H. C. Asher, owner and traffic manager of the San Joaquin Valley Traffic Bureau, said the Interstate Commerce Commission has approved a request by the railroads for an unloading fee in the two Eastern cities. Asher said the additional charge will amount to \$3,000,000 a year increase in rates for California commodities.

'Unloved' 400-Pound Wife Commits Suicide

MUNCIE, Ind., Oct. 27.—(AP)—Mrs. Ruth Moore, 400-pound housewife, killed herself today with a shotgun "because I am too fat and nobody loves me." The quotes come from Patrolman Norman Talbert, who talked to the 33-year-old woman before she died. She was the wife of John Moore, a laborer.

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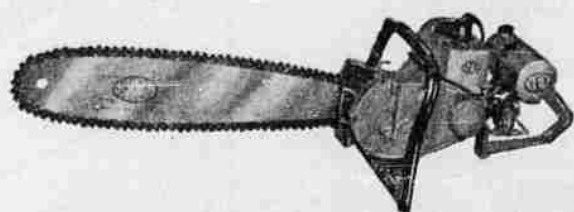
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
