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Electrical Union Sues Atom Board for \$1 Million

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27.—(AP)—The United Electrical Workers (UEW) yesterday filed a \$1,000,000 damage suit against the Atomic Energy Commission.

It is based on the commission's order barring UEW from representing workers in an atomic plant at Schenectady, N. Y., which General Electric Company is operating for the Commission. The suit was filed in U. S. district court here.

The Commission's order barring the Union from representing workers in the Knolls plant at Schenectady was issued, the Commissioner said, for security reasons.

In a letter to the union Saturday, Commission Chairman David E. Lilienthal said the union will be ousted as representative in other atomic plants unless its officers submit non-Communist pledges.

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
