The board said the death, that of a Union County resident, was the sixth for the year due to poliomyelitis.

4. Elementary school section.

Student leaders who attended Junior Red Cross leadership training centers this summer, as well as delegates to the National Junior Red Cross convention in San Francisco in June, will report on community, national and international phases of Junior Red Cross.

The subject of International relations will be discussed at all group meetings. Stephens will serve as a member of the panel in the section meeting for Junior Red Cross chairmen on the topic "The Junior Red Cross Committee: Its Composition, Purposes and Functions."

Music, entertainment and luncheon will be under the auspices of the Benton County Chapter, host at the conference. This is the second annual regional conference series held by Pacific Area Junior Red Cross for the purpose of training leadership and promoting unity among Junior Red Cross members.

During October and November 22 similar meetings will be conducted in seven Western states. Total expected attendance throughout the area is approximately 10,000.

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Bribery Charges Facing British Labor Government

LONDON, Oct. 28.—(P)—Prime Minister Attlee asked parliament yesterday to investigate reports of bribery involving ministers and other officials of his labor government.

Bringing before the House of Commons a scandal which may have far-reaching implications, Attlee blamed "the activities of a certain alien" whom he did not name.

Attlee said J. W. Belcher, parliamentary secretary of the Board of Trade, and "other ministers and officials" were involved in the allegations.

The Commons immediately agreed to set up a judicial tribunal to investigate the reports.

At the same time, Attlee said, the bribery case is under investigation by the London police.

Attlee said the allegations were that "payments, rewards or other considerations have been sought, offered, promised, made or received by or to ministers or other public servants in connection with licenses or permissions, required under any enactment, regulation or order, or in connection with the withdrawal of any prosecution."

He did not disclose the source.

Four specific cases involve an application for import of amusement machinery, permission to issue capital for a football pools company, an application for a building license and withdrawal of prosecution against a football pools firm accused for violating the paper (supply) control regulations.
