Rich Uranium Deposit Found in California

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Uranium has been found in Antelope Valley, the office of the U. S. Geological Survey reported yesterday. The rich deposit is in Los Angeles county near the town of Lancaster.

J. C. Miller, bureau tester, said ore from the ranch of Mike and John Rafferty registered 80—the maximum—on a Geiger counter. Mike Rafferty, a prospector made the discovery after watching burrowing animals bring up earth showing the yellow of carnotite, a uranium-bearing ore. The deposit was found six feet down.
