

Atom Bomb Alone Prevents Slavery, Churchill Says

LONDON, Oct. 29.—(AP)— Winston Churchill told parliament yesterday that only the atom bomb prevents "the enslavement of Europe by Communist forces

directed by the Kremlin." Churchill, singled out by Prime Minister Stalin of Russia a little earlier as "the main instigator of a new war," said the western powers "should put no obstacles in the way of a reconciliation with Germany."

"Our policy should henceforth

be to draw the sponge across the crimes and horrors of the past and look for the sake of our salvation towards the future," the wartime prime minister said. "There can be no revival in Europe without the active and loyal aid of the German tribes."
