

Briton Expects No War in Europe 'For Few Months'

BERLIN, Oct. 29.—(AP)—The British commander in Germany said Tuesday he expected "no war in Europe for the next few months."

Gen. Sir Brian Robertson, the British military governor, told a news conference, however, he did not care to predict what might happen beyond that period.

He said also that withdrawal of occupation troops might be the only way to solve the German problem.

But here, too, he added a major qualification.

"It is my personal opinion," he said, "withdrawal may well be the only means of resolving the difficulties that have led to Allied disagreement."

"However, before one could adopt such a resolution one must be sure conditions are satisfactory for withdrawal."

"If there is any question of the peace of Europe not being secure it might be dangerous for such a withdrawal. One must be sure the Germans would be free—really free—to run their own affairs. It would be unwise if the Germans were to fall victims of some small well-organized minority."

Police Force Unusual

Robertson observed the Russians have organized a "police force" for their zone of Germany now numbering 200,000, with the "final figure reported to be 400,000."

He said it seemed to have an

"unusual character for a police force" because it was equipped with mortars, machine guns and armored cars.

"I don't know why police should have that equipment," he said. "The purpose of all this—well you can guess it as well as I can. There are certain elements of discontent in the Eastern Zone but it seems to me this would not require a force of this size—but then I don't know what goes on there."

The Western Allies have looked on this force as a Russian scheme to turn Germany into a police state which would be Communist-controlled after the occupation troops leave.

Robertson brushed aside the idea the Western Allies might protest to the Russians over the "police force," saying "it would not have any great effect."

Asked if a similar force to counter that organized by the Russians might be organized in the western occupation zones, he said "that is not the sort of policy I should care to match."

Bumpass Hell Not Profanity; Upheld As Springs' Name

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—(AP)—Bumpass Hell is not profanity, the Board of Geographic Names has ruled.

Rather, it is suitably descriptive of a hot springs in northern California. So the Board officially approved the use of that name on all official maps of Lassen Volcanic National Park.

Some authorities had recommended a more refined name, such as Bumpass Inferno or even old Bumpass Hot Springs.

The National Park Service, which had proposed "Hell" in the first place, strongly upheld its stand. It told the Board that residents of the area regarded Bumpass Hell not as a stigma but as an apt and colorful name.

Years ago the Board named the park attraction Bumpass Hot Springs, supposedly for an everyday character named Johnny Bumpass or Bumpass.

Recently, however, files of the Red Bluff, Calif., Independent for Sept. 18 1865, disclosed that

the Springs were discovered by explorer Kendall van Hook Bumpass, who died in 1867.

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Rev. Bernt A. Borrevik Passes Away at 80

EVERETT, Wash., Oct. 29.—(AP) The Rev. Bernt A. Borrevik, 80, long-time Pacific Northwest Lutheran minister who founded several churches, died Monday at his home. He was a graduate of the Augsburg Seminary, Minneapolis, and came to the Northwest in 1897. He organized Lu-

theran Free Churches here, at Bremerton, Portland and Astoria. He retired as pastor of the Silverton, Ore., Lutheran Free Church in 1939, retiring to live here.

His widow, three sons, among them Berge, Reedsport, Ore., and three daughters, Mrs. Esther Weston, Richland; Mrs. Ruth Ranger, Grand Coulee, and Mrs. Selma Smiley, Portland, survive.
