Social Security Facts Offered By Administration

Social Security Administration
The Social Security Administration, through its Bureau of Old-Age and Survivors Insurance, administers a government insurance program which provides a monthly income for insured workers and their families, when the worker retires at the age of 65 or later, and for his family when he dies.

This program is operated entirely by the federal government and should not be confused with the Old-Age Assistance and the Unemployment Insurance programs which are operated by the various states in conjunction with the federal government. Certain similarities between these programs have sometimes led to misunderstandings and the purpose of this explanation is to attempt to clarify the meaning of Old-Age and Survivors Insurance.

First of all, this program is social insurance. Its cost is shared by the worker and the employer. The worker's contribution (or tax) is 1 per cent of the wages he gets on jobs covered by Social Security, up to \$3,000 a year. This contribution is deducted from the employer's wages by his employer and the employer pays a like amount. These wages are reported quarterly by the employers, listing each employe by name, the wages paid to this employe during the quarter and his or her Social Security number. These wages are posted to the credit of each worker on a machine record system at the division of accounting operations of the Social Security Administration in Baltimore, Md.

Who Also Share
A certain amount of work on jobs covered by the Social Security Act is required before any retirement or death benefit can be paid. The monthly payments made fall into two groups: (1) to insured workers age 65 or over who are temporarily or permanently retired; also to their wives, age 65 or over, and to their children under 18; and (2) to the survivors of workers who have died. The worker's age does not matter, only the amount of employment covered by Social Security prior to his death. The beneficiaries may be children under 18; widows (of any age) who have a child under 18 in their care; widows age 65 or over; or dependent parents, age 65 or over. When no survivor is immediately eligible for monthly benefits, at the death of the wage earner, a lump sum payment may be made to the widow or widower, or to the person who paid the funeral expenses.

Must Be Applied For
Old-Age and Survivors Insurance payments are made as a matter of right and are not based upon need. However, benefits are not paid automatically. An application must be filed. For this reason the Social Security Administration has nearly 500 field offices throughout the United States serving the public for this purpose. The field office located in the Post Office Building, Eugene, serves Douglas, Lane, Coos, Curry and Josephine Counties. Everyone who needs information regarding Old-Age and Survivors Insurance, should call or write to this office.

For the purpose of serving wage earners, survivors and others needing Social Security information, a representative of the Eugene office visits Roseburg at the Oregon State Employment Service, 437 North Jackson street, on the first and third Tuesdays of each month between the hours of 8:30 a. m. and noon. All persons needing information or assistance in any phase of Old-Age Survivors Insurance are urged to visit this representative at that time.
