Suspect Questioned In
Murder of 2 Teen-Agers

SEATTLE, Nov. 1.—(AP)—Law
enforcement officials were ques-
tioning an Eau Claire, Wis., man
today in connection with the slay-
ing of two Eau Claire teen-agers
Oct. 23.

He was booked as Marshall
Johnson, 32, former Eau Claire
rubber company employee. He de-
nied any connection with the kill-
ing of Raymond Smith, 18, and
his companion, Gertrude Bau-
mann.

Their bodies were found on an
Eau Claire golf course. The boy
had been shot four times. The
girl had been shot three times
and raped.

Johnson left Eau Claire the
day the bodies were found.
Johnson said he had been con-
sidering giving himself up volun-
tarily after his wife long-dis-
tanced that police were looking
for him.

COUNTS REFUGEES

VIENNA.—(AP)—There is one
displaced person or refugee for
each seven citizens of this coun-
try according to the latest fig-
ures of the International Refugee
Organization (IRO).

IRO figures show there are 425-
000 registered displaced persons
and refugees. In addition there
are 85,000 persons, holding Ger-
man citizenship and persons of
German ancestry expelled from
other countries and 5,000 mis-
cellaneous aliens, all holding In-
definite residence but with no actual
guarantee of Austrian citizenship.
