

California Lead Of Truman Nears Mark of 70,000

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 4 — President Truman's victory margin in California with its 25 electoral votes, rolled toward the 70,000 mark today.

With 14,242 of the 16,802 precincts tallied, Truman had 1,627,746 votes; Gov. Dewey, 1,564,428.

California gained a net of one Democratic congressman, Cecil F. White, Democrat, beat the veteran Republican Bertrand W. Gearhart, in the 9th district. Clinton D. McKinnon, Democrat, defeated Republican Rep. Charles K. Fletcher in the 23rd. In the 1st district, where Rep. Clarence Lea, Democrat, retired, Republican Hubert R. Scudder succeeded to the office.

As southern California neared a complete count decisive results in several congressional contests there were expected soon.

The election showed, among other things, that Californians don't want their liquor laws mediated with them. They turned down two liquor propositions—one providing for modified local option, and the other, giving local officers more voice in liquor law enforcement. Each lost by a million votes.

The proposition to authorize the Public Utilities commission to limit the number of brakemen on trains was approved, with

100,000 lead. The campaign behind this measure said it would eliminate "featherbedding."

The California vote turnout was big. The big contest, Truman vs. Dewey, pulled them to the polls.

Hangman Takes 14 More German War Criminals

MUNICH, Germany, Nov. 5 — Fourteen German war criminals were hanged at Landsberg prison today in a speed-up of executions. One man won a last-minute reprieve.

The men were convicted of killing unarmed American fliers or committing atrocities in concentration camps.

Today's executions brought to 43 the number of men hanged since the war crimes executions were resumed at Landsberg Oct. 15.

German church leaders have protested the hangings, but the U. S. Military Government has refused to take action except in cases where the judge advocate general has certified that new evidence warranted a reprieve.

Europe Lacks Cash To Buy Northwest Fruit

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 5 — Pacific Northwest fruit growers cannot expect to restore fruit shipments to Europe this year.

So said the Oregonian today. The newspaper said Dr. F. A. Motz, Department of Agriculture economist, was telling fruit industry leaders that European countries did not have the necessary cash.

The paper added that Motz also pointed out that the European recovery program would make loans enabling Europe to buy fruit.

He was quoted as saying recovery program officials rejected the idea. The only exports will be "essential" recovery goods—mostly machinery, the economist was quoted as saying.
