

## Oregon Squeezes Out 13-7 Victory Over Washington

SEATTLE, Nov. 2.—(P)—Oregon, the team which has been barely good enough one week and a half, still was unwhipped today in the Pacific Coast Conference football race because last Saturday was no exception.

It was just barely good enough to squeeze out a 13-7 decision over Washington. The 33,000 fans who put a crimp in their torments when Washington broke a three-game touchdown but went away wondering if Oregon might not be just barely good enough if the cards could be reshuffled to give it a crack at California.

California has more power, but Oregon has Norm Van Brocklin. The junior quarterback fired two touchdown passes in the last half that were completed in spite of a tight Washington defense.

California has a line that runs like a bulldozer, but Oregon has Dick Wilkins and Dan Garza, a couple of wingmen who can climb the sky to pull in a Van Brocklin pass. Wilkins snagged five Saturday, taking one 26-yard touchdown heave right over one shoulder at full gallop.

California can drive to a pair of Jacks—Jensen and Swanner—to get a full house of first downs, but Oregon has, in Bob Sanders, a back who can ramble and keep the defense tight to open the way for a passing thrust. Sanders hit the middle on two occasions for 23 yards and lugged the ball 14 times for an average of five and a half yards per lug.

It was an even scrap through the first half but Van Brocklin and Wilkins went touchdowning in the first Oregon play of the third quarter. In the final stanza the Oregon arm wafted one 19 yards to Garza for the other Web-foot tally.

Washington came roaring back with a 65-yard drive all the way to the payoff line, with Marshall Dallas scoring. Dallas also was a defensive standout, along with tackle George Bayer of Washington.

That Van Brocklin can kick, too. He punted two out of bounds inside the Washington five and missed the corner by an eyelash on a third.
