

France Protests West Germany's Recovery Speed

BERLIN, Nov. 10. — (AP) — Western observers anticipated today to assess the seriousness of a French threat to slow down West Germany's recovery.

Authoritative sources said Gen. Pierre Koenig, the French military governor, protested at a government conference last week that Western Germany was recovering too rapidly.

Koenig reportedly threatened that unless this recovery was slowed down, he would withhold approval from the Western German constitution, now being formed, and the merger of the French zone into a tri-zone.

The informants said U. S. Gen. Lucius D. Clay and Britain's Gen. Sir Brian Robertson replied that as long as the American and British taxpayers were sinking millions into Germany recovery, it would be pushed as rapidly as possible until Germany could pay her own way.

Germany is not expected to be self-sufficient before 1952.

Meanwhile plans are ahead to evacuate aged and ill Berliners in outgoing airlift planes to spare them the hardships of winter in the blockaded city.

British authorities said they hope to fly up to 500 persons daily to Luebeck, in the British zone, where the German Red Cross will receive the evacuees.

Falsehoods Nailed

Col. Frank L. Howley, U. S. commander in Berlin, today branded as "propaganda poppycock" communist charges that he was trying to "provoke civil war" here by promising to protect Western Berlin against any attempts at an armed Communist coup.

The Russian-controlled press burst out with a rash of personal attacks against Howley because of his statement Monday assuring western Berliners that their forthcoming elections would be protected against Communist interference.

Howley said he gave these assurances because Western Sector German officials had expressed concern about the Russian action of arming Eastern Berlin police with automatic weapons and training them in their use.

Election Boon To U. S. Jobholders

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10. — (AP) — The election gave thousands of federal jobholders a tighter grip on their jobs—but for some 900 of them it meant they'll get their jobs officially.

Senator Lucas (D-Ill.) said today one of the first acts of the new Democratic-controlled Senate in January will be the speedy approval of all stalemate nominations.

"There'll be no delay in confirming those appointments," Lucas predicted to reporters. And his word carries weight because he is generally expected to be the new majority leader.

Beginning early this year, the GOP-controlled 80th Congress refused to act on the huge batch of nominations sent to Capitol Hill by President Truman. Party leaders were confident that by doing nothing the plums would fall to Republicans under a Republican president.

But the Democratic victory at the polls last week assured the hundreds of anxious nominees their jobs are safe.

More than 700 of them are postmasters scattered throughout the country.

PORTLAND, Nov. 10. — (AP) — Oregon's law against the sale of crime comic books is valid, Rex Kimmell, deputy attorney general for Oregon, insisted here yesterday.

He told State Sen. Jack Lynch, who submitted several books for an opinion, that the books were in violation of the law.

Kimmell added that a recent Supreme Court decision against a similar New York State law did not apply to Oregon. The Oregon law, Kimmell said, is more definite and "is presumed to be constitutional."
