International Police Force Has Backing at Grange

PORTLAND, Me., Nov. 15.—(AP)—The National Grange convention was asked by one of its committees today to urge creation of an international police force to preserve world order.

Such a police force, the committee said, should be under control of a greatly-strengthened United Nations.

The Grange committee on national welfare declared in a report that it "appears now that some kind of limited world government" may be necessary to maintain peace.

The report will act on the report later in the week.

Such a government, the welfare committee said, should have a legislative body to enact laws related to world peace, a world court to interpret the laws and a police force to enforce them.

The committee said the United States should take the lead in securing a revision of the UN charter that would greatly limit use of the veto. Only those UN actions which clearly relate to the internal affairs and sovereignty of nations should be subject to the veto, it said.

Endorsement of the Marshall aid plan for Europe also was recommended.

Other Proposals Made

On domestic issues, the committee proposed that the Grange favor only such modifications in the Taft-Hartley labor law "as may be necessary to correct abuses or weaknesses that are shown to exist." It did not say what those weaknesses might be.

It opposed congressional proposals to place state militias under federal control.

It urged state Granges to press their states for ratification of a proposed constitutional amendment limiting presidents and vice presidents to two four-year terms.

The convention also was asked to favor statehood for Alaska, and to work for continued civilian control of atomic energy.

Declaring that further governmental regulations and controls of the economy appear possible, the committee urged industry, labor and agriculture to get together and develop a program of economic cooperation that would make such controls unnecessary.

Such a conference, it said, should be held to develop "price, wage and profit policies that will reduce friction and stimulate a greater spirit of cooperation and understanding."

The convention will devote today and tomorrow to the awarding of the Grange's seventh degree to an expected class of about 25,000 members from various parts of the country.

The degrees will be given at colorful ceremonies closed to the public.
