Avoid Antifreeze With Salt Base, Motorists Told

In view of the shortage in safe antifreeze solutions this year, the Oregon State Motor Association advises Oregon motorists to check solutions carefully before purchasing to avoid the danger of getting solutions harmful to the cooling system.

Solutions to be avoided are those with a salt base, such as calcium or magnesium chlorides, the association said. The U. S. Bureau of Standards, as a result of tests, report that these solutions attack the ignition system of the car, causing dangerous shorts, as well as exerting costly corrosive effects on the motor and radiator.

Solutions that are safe to use are those with the simple alcohols and the ethylene glycols. The alcohol solutions are those based on methyl, or wood alcohol; ethyl, or grain alcohol; and isopropyl alcohol. The ethylene glycol solutions are the most desirable, since they boil at a higher temperature than water and hence are known as "permanent" types.

"It is difficult for the layman to tell whether or not he is getting a safe solution," the Association said, "but one fairly certain rule-of-thumb is the weight. The ethylene glycol, heaviest of the safe solutions, weighs less than 94 pounds per gallon. If an antifreeze, exclusive of container, weighs more than this, it probably is a salt base solution."

"Another test is to evaporate a small portion of the solution. The salt base solutions will leave a considerable deposit."

Ship Clerks, Checkers Sue for Overtime Pay

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 17 — (AP)—34 ship clerks and checkers in the Portland area have filed suit in U. S. district court for overtime pay. Defendants in the action are 61 steamship and stevedoring companies doing business in Oregon.

One of the attorneys for the plaintiffs, Leo Levenson, said the suit is based on provisions of the fair labor standards act. He said the clerks and checkers seek additional overtime pay under a recent Supreme Court decision which established a formula for computing the overtime.
