Countess O. K. On Blue Blood, But Checks are N. G.

VIRGINIA CITY, Nev., Nov. 18.—(AP)—The "Countess," who had no more luck with writing checks than playing poker, seems to have more blue blood than blue chips in her background.

"Countess" Honya C. A. Krasnodebsky is still trying to get out of Storey County Jail. District Attorney Robert Berry said all she needs is \$2,200 to cover a check she wrote when the checks of a poker-playing companion bounced.

Meanwhile, in Philadelphia Mrs. Hedwig Krasnodebsky said she was Honya's mother and recited a minor aristocratic lineage of her husband's side of the family, which came from Poland.

In four days of poker playing Burdette Beveridge, 39, Vancouver, Wash., wrote checks to keep Honya in chips. Beveridge was arrested on a bad check charge and was released and disappeared after the "Countess" gave her check to cover his. But Berry said her check had as much spring as Beveridge's. Since then the "Countess" has been making transcontinental and international telephone calls to raise the \$2,200.

Her mother said she couldn't help. Two weeks ago Honya got

her last \$300, Mrs. Krasnodebsky said.
