PORTLAND, Maine, Nov. 18.—(AP)—The State Grange master of Idaho, who has been eating Maine potatoes for a week, admitted yesterday they haven't given him indigestion.

Master George Hersley—who comes from one of the leading potato-growing states—laughingly denied "reports" he had brought enough potatoes with him to last the entire 10 days of the national Grange convention. Maine is the nation's leading potato producing state.

And he likes them, he said. But he added quickly that Idaho's Long Russet variety has no peer when it comes to baking.

Sill in his beautiful poem, "Opportunity," tells the story of a battle in which both a prince and a coward were engaged. Disgusted with his own sword, he broke it, and flinging it far from him, crept away from the battlefield. Then came the king's son, sorely wounded for he had lost his weapon in the fight. Seeing the coward's sword, half-buried in the sand, he rushed forward and grasped it, and with this broken weapon turned the tide of battle and saved a great cause. How often people fail because they reject the highest values and choose the lesser. The greatest error a man can make is to reject Christ. 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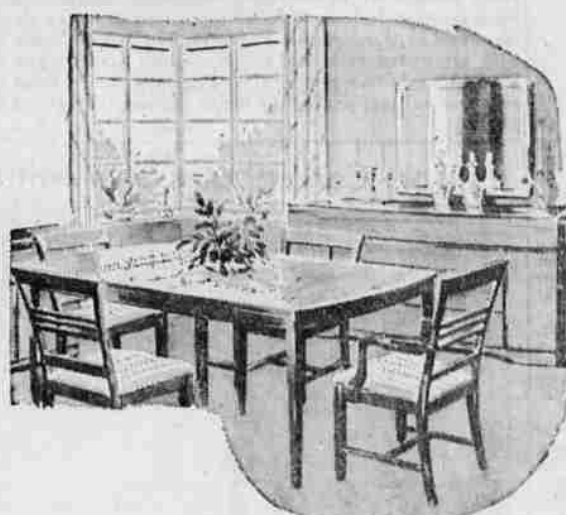
