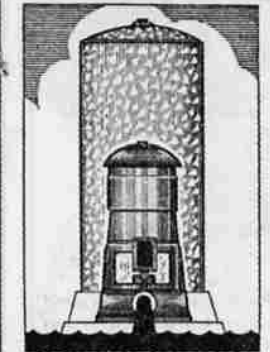

Multnomah Majority For Truman 7,184

PORTLAND, Nov. 19.—(AP)—President Truman carried Multnomah County, the most heavily populated in the state by 7184 votes, the official election count disclosed today. He got 93,703 to 86,519 for Gov. Thomas E. Dewey, but upstate support gave Oregon's six electoral votes to the Republicans. The county favored only one other Democrat for major office—Walter J. Pearson, who was elected state treasurer. His vote in the county was 99,211 to Republican Howard C. Belton's 75,834.

Bank of St. Helens Nearly Ready to Open Doors

ST. HELENS, Nov. 19.—(AP)—The Bank of St. Helens will go into business here soon. To be capitalized at \$125,000, it has been approved by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and the State Banking Department. The final step will be to issue incorporation papers. Temporary officers include Joe Fisher, Portland automobile dealer, as President, and Irving T. Rau, pulp and paper company official here, as Vice President.

California, Oregon Face Final Games For Bowl Honor

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 19.—(AP)—The 1948 Pacific Coast Conference grid campaign blazes into the climactic stage tomorrow, with the two top games finding California and Oregon battling tough traditional foes in their respective drives to capture the Rose Bowl honor.

About a quarter-million fans will elbow their way into four conference stadia, with the slate reading like this: Berkeley—California vs. Stanford in their 31st encounter, before a packed arena of 82,000 souls gathered to cheer or jeer the Golden Bears in their bid for the unblemished season and the Rose Bowl nomination.

Corvallis—Oregon's Webfoots invading Oregon State's home grounds for the 52nd engagement of their series. The Webfoots face their first team to Pasadena in 18 years, before 22,000 fans, which is all the place will hold.

Los Angeles—Southern California's favored Trojans and UCLA in their 18th cross-town feud, with some 90,000 expected to witness the struggle for the mythical college championship of the city of Los Angeles.

Seattle—The Washington Huskies against little Idaho, and the Huskies may be hard-pressed to win their second game of the season before 25,000 hopeful home-folks.

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French Premier Seeks Vote in Fresh Crisis

PARIS, Nov. 19.—(AP)—The French cabinet today gave Premier Henri Queuille permission to ask the national assembly for a vote of confidence.

Queuille said he would go before the parliament Tuesday to ask approval of the way his cabinet strove to handle the Communist-ordered strikes that cost France 9,000,000 tons of coal in seven weeks.

The move for a vote of confidence came as Communist labor leaders ordered a 24-hour strike today of merchant marine officers, in what is expected to be a Communist attempt to paralyze all French ports.

A general strike of dock workers, with no time limit, has been called for Monday and the merchant marine may join it.

92 Boys Turn Out For Basketball Play at Junior Hi

Bus Travis, Benchwarmer president, said 92 boys up through junior high school age have turned out for Benchwarmer-sponsored basketball practice sessions in the Junior High School gymnasium during the past week. The sessions are held every Monday night from 7 to 9 o'clock, and are open to all boys wishing to learn basketball fundamentals and who want to play in competition.

Travis said the boys will be teamed up according to height and weight and will start playing after the first of the year. Games will be scheduled for Saturdays in the Junior High Gymnasium.
