

### Catholic Bishops Accuse Court Of Cooperation Ban

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—(AP)—The nation's Roman Catholic Bishops accuse the supreme court of barring "any cooperation between government and organized religion which would aid religion."

This is the effect of the way the court interprets the "establishment of religion" clause of the constitution, the bishops contend.

Congress meant, they said, that there shall be no official national religion, no federal preferment among religions, and no federal interference in church-state relations of the states. But the bishops say the court ignores logic and the cooperation between church and state that is always taken for granted.

They said they will work to change this interpretation.

The bishops declared there is danger of judicial "establishment of secularism" that would "ban God from public life."

The bishops took particular exception to the high court's 8-to-1 decision last March that religious sects may not use public schools to teach their beliefs.

That case stemmed from a protest by Mrs. Vashti McCollum, an atheist, that the Champaign, Ill., school board violated the first amendment to the constitution by permitting religious education in the school buildings after regular hours.

of the league's nine faculty representatives.

Undefeated Michigan was the Big Nine's champion for the second straight year, but the Wolverines were ineligible for a return trip to Pasadena. A conference restriction bans any team from making more than one Rose Bowl appearance in three years.

Thus Northwestern, beaten only by Michigan in six league starts, received the bid to face the Pacific Coast conference representative in the battle of roses.

EUGENE, Ore., Nov. 22.—(AP)—Leo Harris, director of athletics at the University of Oregon, and Jim Aiken, head football coach, both congratulated the University of California today on its selection as the Pacific Coast Conference representative in the Rose Bowl game next January 1.

Harris added: "We at Oregon are certain that California's football team will ably represent the confer-

ence in the game with the Western Conference team on January 1 at Pasadena."

Coach Aiken added: "We are naturally disappointed, but at the same time we are certain that California is a fine football team and will do an excellent job in the Rose Bowl."

whelming voting strength, planned to adopt a number of resolutions that the left wing objects to.

For example: endorsing the Marshall plan, paving the way for a possible withdrawal from the world federation of trade unions, and raising from 5 cents a month to 8 cents the per capita tax, which unions pay to the national CIO for each of their members.

Proposals Listed Here are some of the suggestions that have been discussed by various right-wingers:

1. A change in the CIO constitution to require all CIO officers and members of the 51-executive board to follow national CIO policies or resign their CIO positions.

2. An election campaign to prevent Albert J. Fitzgerald from being re-elected as CIO vice-president. Fitzgerald, president of the United Electrical Workers, was the only one of the nine CIO vice-presidents who supported Henry Wallace in defiance of CIO policy. Some are talking about running William Townsend, president of the transport service workers, against him.

3. A change in CIO rules to permit President Murray to revoke charters of city and state CIO councils without going through the lengthy procedures which had to be followed in the New York City council case.

4. A movement—or at least the threat of a movement—to expel any unions from the CIO whose leaders refuse to conform to CIO policies.

Today it seemed most unlikely that such a drastic step will be taken. Hardly anyone expects the CIO unions to split apart into two separate organizations.

There was never any likelihood that left-wingers would dare to lead their unions out of the CIO voluntarily because they would instantly become the target of membership raiding by CIO organizing committees which would be created.

From Shanghai the transport Butner sailed with 123 Americans plus 39 Navy dependents. The ship will pick up 40 more Americans at Tsingtao.

(Concern in the highest circles over the military situation showed itself in a radio speech by Madame Chiang Kai-Shek from Nanking over a nationwide American network. Calling for "immediate and definite" U. S. aid, the generalissimo's wife declared: "If China falls, all of Asia goes.")

(The Communist radio warned the United States in so many words to keep out of China's civil war. It said the Communists consider foreign aid to the Chiang regime "an act of hostility." The broadcast was heard in San Francisco by the Associated Press.)

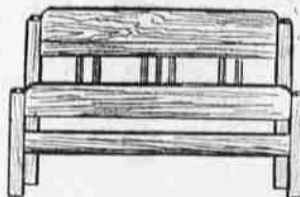
