Husband Assails Deed In Answer to Divorce Suit

That a property deed conveying title to their home at 222 W. 1st Ave. N. to his wife, Fannie, he set aside was asked of the Circuit Court by Melvin C. Whipp, Roseburg, in an answer filed Saturday to his wife's recent suit for divorce.

Whipp charged that he had been "intimidated" into signing the deed by threats and by the "false promise" of his wife to withhold filing of the divorce suit. He said he was "sick" and did not know the significance of the paper he signed until he was ordered by his wife's attorney to remove himself from the home.

The home was bought and furnished in 1945 "largely" with Whipp's earnings, he said. He asked for a decree setting aside the title conveyance as "void" and determining that he and his

wife are "tenants in common" of the property.
The Whipp were married Dec. 1, 1923, at Eugene. Whipp is employed as an automobile mechanic and Mrs. Whipp as a waitress.

Funeral Services Set For Former Legislator

PORTLAND, Nov. 22.—(AP)—Funeral services will be held here Monday for Fred W. German, 69, ex-state legislator, who died Thursday night.

German, a former Multnomah County Commissioner and ex-president of the Portland Realty Board, first entered the legislature in 1924.

Surviving are a son, Frank W. German, Umatilla; and a daughter, Mrs. Rose Hollenbeck, Portland.
