Oregon's Money Plight Laid to Growing Pains

PORTLAND, Nov. 20. — (P) — The Association of Oregon Counties was told yesterday that Oregon is suffering from growing pains.

That's one of the reasons, said State Tax Commissioner Wallace S. Wharton, for the confused financial muddle in this state.

Wharton told the convention that both state and local governments can straighten out the fiscal tangle if they think the problem through, and develop a long-range plan for all the taxing units.

Wharton proposed in-training courses for assessors and tax collectors; a standard basic record system to unify assessments and tax collection; and direct aid in appraising properties.

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
