German Pigs, Four Footed,
Invade Switzerland

SCHAFFHAUSEN, Switzerland — (AP) — Switzerland is fighting desperately against a German invasion.

The invaders are wild pigs. Hordes of wild pigs from the Black Forest are fleeing from the attacks of hungry Germans and crossing Switzerland's northern frontier.

Swiss farmers complain that in the agricultural districts of the canton of Schaffhausen, north of the Rhine River, the German pigs have done incalculable damage to crops.

Since meat is not rationed in Switzerland, the townspeople have little incentive to roam the hills in search of edible wild pork. Apart from occasional hunting expeditions organized by the local farmers, the German invaders have found Switzerland a haven of refuge and have shown no desire to return to their native pastures.

Demand for vigorous Swiss action to wipe out the invaders are being made by rural communities in the canton of Schaffhausen. The question even threatens to become a political issue in the cantonal assembly of

Censor at Singapore

SINGAPORE — (AP) — Donald Duck and his associates are about the only actors immune from Malaya's film censor. That's because the censor, Jack Evans, has a soft spot for them.

They're lucky, for under state of emergency regulations the censor is cracking down on moviegoers. He has orders to weed out blood-and-thunder epics which might inspire trigger-happy terrorist elements to greater activity. Singapore's movie audiences favor serial dramas. They sit through 25 to 31 reels at a time without squirming.

Generally there's less serious gunplay in serials than in ordinary feature films on crime. Censor Evans explains, so they can usually be passed. Dick Tracy beats Mrs. Miniver at the box office any day. But he has to compete with Donald.

Swiss, French Find Border
After 100 Years of Doubt

GENEVA, Switzerland — (AP) — The lost border between France and Switzerland has been found and marked and everybody is happy again. Some farmers who thought they were Swiss are paying French taxes and some who thought they were French now find their farms are in Switzerland. The correction was made after more than 100 years of uncertainty along the Jura mountain frontier of western Switzerland. It involved a stretch of about fifteen miles.

The frontier was fixed in 1824, but the Duke of Neuenberg on the Swiss side and his Imperial French colleagues neglected to mark it for posterity. Peasants in the region have been asking themselves for years whether they really were in Switzerland or France.

Now the people who worry about such things finally have cut a path twelve feet wide through the woods and weeds to mark the spot.

Twenty Schools Get
One-Fifth of Students

NEW YORK — (AP) — Twenty per cent of all college students in the United States are enrolled in 20 colleges and universities, says the U. S. Office of Education.

The figures, just released, are based upon returns from practically all of the Nation's 1,800 institutions of higher learning. Those show that out of a peak enrollment of 2,410,000 students, 481,267 are studying at New York University, (47,647); University of California, (43,469); City College of New York, (28,567); Columbia University, (27,243); University of Minnesota, (25,920); University of Illinois, (25,920); Northwestern University, (23,788); University of Indiana, (23,131); University of Southern California, (22,740); University of Wisconsin, (22,333); University of Michigan, (21,002); Syracuse University, (19,698); University of Texas, (19,676); University of Pittsburgh, (19,526); University of Pennsylvania, (18,644); Boston University, (18,617); Wayne University, (18,455); Temple University, (17,212); University of Washington, (16,650).

New York, says the Office of Education, leads all other states again this year in number of persons enrolled, with a total of 123,912. California, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Texas and Michigan follow, with each registering total college enrollments of over 100,000.

Communist Can't
Believe in God,
House Group Says

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22. — (AP) — "You cannot be a Communist and believe in God," the House Un-American Activities committee said today.

That, the committee added in a summation entitled "100 things you should know about Communism and religion" is "the long and the short of it."

"You cannot believe in God and have a peaceable life under Communism," the document declared. "In all their plans and actions, the Communists mark down religion as enemy No. 1. Where they dominate, they attack it head on. Where they do not dominate, they try to deceive and corrupt from within just as they do in government, in education, in labor unions, and throughout a nation's general life."

The aim and object of Communism is always the same — complete control over the human mind and body, asleep and awake, in sickness and in health, from birth to death. That is why Communism marks religion enemy No. 1.

"Communism cannot dominate family life, for example, until it has first fought its way past the influence of religion upon the family."

"Communism cannot dominate unless it has the power to remake the life of the people. It cannot ignore religion and do that."

The committee's report was in the form of 100 questions it asked and then answered. The document is one in a series to be made public between now and the end of the year.

The others deal with education, labor, and government. Already published: "100 things you should know about Communism in the U. S. A."
