Funeral services were held at the Unger Funeral Home at Roseburg Sunday at 11 a. m. for Mrs. Martha Butler, 82, who died in that city Friday at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Walter Brookhart. Martha Ann Gless

was born in Germany on Oct. 24, 1865.

She came to the United States with her parents at the age of four in 1869, and settled in the Lower Umpqua Valley, where she has made her home since. She was married in 1880 to James Rufus Butler, who died in 1931. To them were born 10 children, seven of whom survive: Mrs. Ethel Jones, Coos Bay; Herbert Butler, Reedsport; Mrs. Mary Bissett, Wickenburg, Ariz.; Mrs. Virgie Brookhart, Reedsport; Walter Butler, Seattle, Wash.; Mrs. Gladys Cairns, Reedsport; and Mrs. Violet Barrett, Bakersfield, Calif. She also survived by two sisters, Mrs. Katie Storm, Rupert, Ida., and Mrs. Emma Austin, Coos Bay, and by 19 grandchildren and 21 great grandchildren.

She was a member of the Three Rivers Rebecca Lodge of Reedsport and the American Legion Auxiliary. She was affectionately known throughout the entire community as "Grandma" Butler.

The service was in charge of Rev. Jesse Griffith of Eugene, former pastor of the Reedsport Community Church. Six of her grandchildren served as pallbearers. Interment was in the Scottsburg Cemetery. The Butler home for many years was on Mill Creek, when the only access there was by boat.

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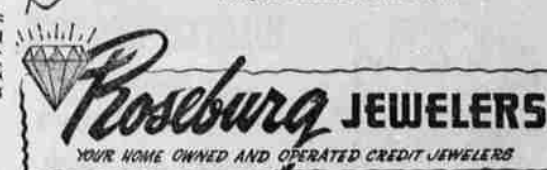

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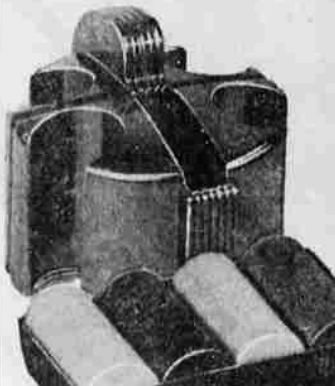
