Supply Company Sues On Logging Equipment Bill

Abe and Isadore J. Bean, doing business as the Olympia Supply Company, have filed suit in Circuit Court against Harry Dean and A. E. Goodwin, asking for judgment for \$719.52 alleged due for miscellaneous logging equipment and mill supplies sold by the plaintiffs to the defendants between Aug. 7 and Sept. 1, 1948.

Nov. 15, 1948, at \$40 per thousand.
In another suit brought against Wixson, Virgil E. McKinney demands judgment for \$278.95, alleged due for logs hauled by McKinney from Pistol River to Roseburg.

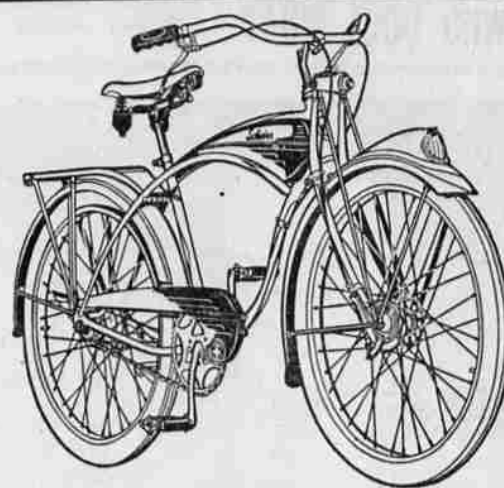
