Oregon to Battle Dixie Methodists In Cotton Bowl

DALLAS, Tex., Nov. 29.—(AP)—The Cotton Bowl has come up with Southern Methodist and Oregon for its Jan. 1 football classic and officials say they figure they have a top attraction. Coach Matty Bell of Southern Methodist says he knows darn well Oregon will be a tough outfit for his team to handle. Oregon, which finished undefeated in the Pacific Coast conference race, was voted out of the Rose Bowl in favor of California, which also was undefeated but won less conference games than did the Webfoots. Saturday, Oregon got permission from its conference to play in the Cotton Bowl. Like Southern Methodist, Oregon lost a game over the full season route. But it was Michigan, the nation's No. 1 team, "Who didn't lose to Michigan?" asked Bell. His team was defeated by Missouri, which was slaughtered by Oklahoma. Coach Jim Aiken of Oregon was here Saturday to scout Southern Methodist in its 7-7 tie with Texas Christian closing the Southwest Conference season. He said

Baby Treatment Stops Rowdiness At Football Games

BOSTON, Nov. 29.—(AP)—A little baby treatment—diapers and all—is the thing to curb rowdiness and vandalism. Judge John H. Connelly suggested the treatment might put an end to Thanksgiving Day football brawls which were numerous in Greater Boston over the holiday.

He explained in a post-holiday interview that his court had excellent results with the treatment. It consists of sentencing the rowdies to live the lives of babies for 24 hours during which they wear diapers, drink from nipple bottles, and play in a baby-pen.

He said no one ever subjected to the "cure" came back to his Juvenile Court. The Boston Juvenile Court judge told a reporter that the offenders were placed in custody of their parents who cooperated in imposing the treatment. A probation officer made the rounds to see that the "sentences" were carried out in full. "I am very happy," Judge Connelly said, "that no one of those boys has been in any kind of trouble in the year since."

"It cured them of what we explained to them was stupid, unthinking mischief that only babies can be allowed to commit."

The boys were convicted of destroying school property.
