How to Cook Turkey Shown in Slidefilms

Scientific methods of cooking the traditional holiday turkey can relieve the housewife of the fear that the finished product might not be just as she had planned. A color slide film entitled "How to Cook Turkey" is available through the county extension office in Roseburg.

The commentary with the film points out that the turkey should be roasted at a constant low temperature for best results. When a constant temperature of 300 degrees F. is maintained the bird will be tender, nicely browned, uniformly cooked with less shrinkage and more drippings than if a higher temperature is used. With low temperature roasting there need be no cover, no

searing, no water, no basting. Many important points about preparing the bird for the oven, testing for doneness, and carving are included in the slidefilm, which was prepared by the Poultry and Egg National Board.

Groups wishing to have the slidefilm shown at meetings may make arrangements by calling the county extension office, 323 or writing the county extension agent (Home Economics), Federal Building, Roseburg. Available dates for the showing of the film will be between December 3 and December 10, afternoons or evenings.
