

Umpqua Post of Legion Boosts Its Membership

Umpqua Post, No. 16, American Legion, set a new high in early membership on Armistice Day,

having a total of 353 members paid up for 1949. William E. "Dutch" Mills, membership chairman, states that a total of 400 members have been signed up to date, and that he expects a total

of 700 by Dec. 31.

A total of 72 new members are now on the roster. Plans for an initiation of a large class of new Legionnaires is made for the third week in January.

All veterans who served between the dates of April 6, 1917, and Nov. 11, 1918 in World War I, and between the dates of Dec. 7, 1941, and Sept. 2, 1945, in World War II, are eligible for membership in the American Legion.

A challenge to Medford Post, No. 15, American Legion, for a membership contest has not yet been accepted, Mills states.
