Auto License Plates for '49 Now Available

Approximately 125 automobile license plates for 1949 were issued at the temporary office set-up in the third floor lobby of the Douglas County Courthouse the opening day Wednesday, Dec. 1, announced Allena Rose, in charge of the office.

R. W. Petterson, from Secretary of State Newbry's vehicle division and here this week to assist Mrs. Rose in setting up the office, stated that plans are to establish permanent quarters in Roseburg, as soon as a suitable place can be obtained, and combine the license sales division with the issuing of automobile operators license.

More than 20,000 license plates and registration certificates are expected to be issued in Douglas County for 1949, although many of them will be taken care of by direct mail from the Salem department, according to Petterson. There were 18,374 licenses issued for 1948, which were 4000 greater than in 1947. The sales staff during peak demands will probably have to be enlarged to four, he said.

Law Provisions Cited—Specific instructions to motorists are that only cars that have been licensed in Oregon during 1948 may be registered beginning Dec. 1. Cars licensed in other states in 1948 and new cars not previously licensed may not be registered until Dec. 15.

No motorist may attach his license plates until after Dec. 15. The license costs only \$5 for touring cars by the direct sales method. The 25-cent fee usually charged has been eliminated this year. Applicants are advised to bring their certificates of registration cards, as no files are available here for checking.

License plates for touring cars and trucks are issued from the local office, along with the receipts of registration. Farm truck license plates will not be available until next week, as the plates have not yet arrived. The plates are black numerals on grey background.

Establishment of an office here, said Petterson, is part of Secretary of State Newbry's plan to expedite the handling of licenses in the state. Other offices have been established in Portland, Salem, Eugene, Oregon City and Coos Bay. Formerly certificates of registration only were handled through the Sheriff's office in this county, and the plates had to be mailed out from the Salem office.

3 Oregon Cities Forced To Use Grade C Milk

PORTLAND, Dec. 2.—(P)—Milk is in such short supply in Oregon City, Albany and Eugene that consumers are forced to use Grade C, the State Department of Agriculture reports.

The department noted that in Albany, which is not under the state milk control law, marketing Grade C milk is two cents a quart less than standard Grade A. But in the other two cities consumers are paying the same prices.

Voluntary 'Brown Out' Eases Power Shortage

PORTLAND, Dec. 2.—(P)—The voluntary electric "brown out" plan is winning out over the peak hour power shortages here. Both major electric firms report outdoor advertising display lights, theaters and other commercial users are curtailing power from 4:30 to 6:30 p. m.

Oregon Kin Takes French Boy's Care

NEW YORK, Dec. 2.—(P)—Claude DeHaro, 15-year-old French boy, was admitted to the United States yesterday to live in Oregon with relatives.

The Immigration and Naturalization Service said it had been decided to admit the boy after arrangements had been made for him to live with Mrs. Lovell Birmier, of Rainier, a sister of his stepfather.

Claude had been held at Ellis Island since his arrival by air from Casablanca Nov. 12.

He had expected to be met by

his mother, Mrs. Lloyd D. Richards, but learned she was in Tokyo with her Army husband.

But the Immigration Service said Mrs. Birmier had agreed to take him into her home. He was placed in the care of the Travelers Aid Society pending departure for Oregon.

The boy said he was "very happy to be in the United States" but that he expected to go to Tokyo to join his mother.
