Harold E. Schmeer, above, local branch manager of the United States National Bank of Portland, has been appointed to serve as a director of the Douglas County Chapter of the American Red Cross. It was announced by Allen E. Clute, chapter chairman. Schmeer came to Roseburg in March this year from Redmond, where he had served as branch manager of the U. S. National Bank. He has been with the bank since 1921, with the exception of an 11-year period between 1935 and 1946, when he was in the investment business in Portland. Schmeer commented that he was "glad of the opportunity to be of service to the community through the Red Cross." He added that the chapter would receive his "whole-hearted support" during his coming term of appointment.

Senior High Students Efficient in Fire Drills

Roseburg Senior High School's 630 students have been evacuated in a minimum of one minute, 30 seconds, and a maximum of one minute, 40 seconds in recent fire drills. Principal Alva Laws announced today.

At least ten drills, averaging about one a week, have been held since the start of school, and not more than a 10-second variation has been reported for any drill.

according to Laws. Drills the last three weeks have averaged about one minute, 35 seconds for evacuation of the building, he said.
