

Red Cross Board Of Directors To Meet on Dec. 13

The Douglas County Chapter, American Red Cross, board of directors will hold their regular monthly meeting in the chapter offices in the Roseburg Armory, Monday, Dec. 13, at 8 p. m. The public is invited to attend.

Allen E. Clute, chairman, announced the agenda will have two items of major interest: (1) proposed amendments to the by-laws, and (2) preliminary planning for the 1949 fund campaign beginning March 1.

The proposed amendments are for the purpose of simplification and clarification of certain sections of the by-laws, to bring the chapter operations into conformity with National Red Cross policies and operational procedures, to make changes in the number

of members to constitute the board of directors, committees and quorums, to specify the methods of filling vacancies and the conduct of elections to assure better community representation, to more definitely specify the duties of the officers, and re-define the procedures of making amendments.

Demands for the services which the Red Cross could and should provide are increasing, Clute states. The first aid and water safety programs should be expanded tenfold. Daily highway accidents emphasize the need for highway first aid stations. New swimming pools in Drain and Roseburg require the expansion of the water safety program in order that full advantage of these facilities may be realized. Recreation committee, under extreme difficulties, conducted the only Red Cross sponsored swimming program in Douglas County this year, issuing 149 certificates to those children who completed the course. The support of the Douglas County communities at the time of the March fund campaign will determine if such programs are to be continued and expanded, Clute said, in urging the public to attend the next board meeting Dec. 13.
