Planning Commission recommendation that Rice Street from Stephens to Main and Flood Street from Stephens to Mills be widened as soon as funds are available was referred to the city manager and the street committee for consideration.

The city manager was authorized to immediately arrange for the installation of four bracket lamps with 6000-watt bulbs on the Deer Creek bridge on North Jackson. The city manager reported this could be done at relatively low cost to the city.

The council recommended that the Stone Piano Co., operating a piano sales business with headquarters at Flegel's Transfer, be required to post a \$1500 bond until the business could be permanently established.

respectively. These sections were recently annexed to the city. Again coming up for considerable discussion was the problem of whether the city or affected property owners were responsible for rebuilding sidewalks and driveways along Military, Corey and Harvard Streets, now being widened to 40 foot widths at city expense.

The sidewalk, especially along Military, is considerably higher than the curb since the street widening, and property owners are unable to use their driveways. A pedestrian hazard at night time is also faced, the Council has pointed out, and an alteration of the sidewalks and driveways is deemed necessary.

Responsibility Shifted The city manager, instead of the city engineer, hereafter will be responsible for the ordering of any additional work to be done by contractors on contract jobs, the council decided, after some rather heated discussion relative to authorization of additional expenditures by the city engineer for work on South Jackson.

It was brought out that since the original amount of base gravel for South Jackson was insufficient because of the muddy condition, the engineer had authorized additional gravel at the city's expense.
