

Papoose Hoopsters Getting in Shape For Season's Tilts

Hod Turner's Papoosees held their first basketball scrimmage Monday night at the Junior High School basketball court after nearly two weeks of fundamentals, including warming up exercises, dribbling, passing and executing other basic basketball tactics.

Turner said the entire Papoose schedule has not yet been definitely established, but league games have been arranged with Grants Pass, Medford and Ashland. Other games tentatively set to be played include tilts with Douglas County B league freshmen and sophomores, Cottage Grove and Springfield. No dates have been arranged here, however.

Turner said he would try to line up several practice games before the league opener against Grants Pass on Jan. 7. Current plans are to schedule two or three practice tilts before and a couple during the holiday season.

Thirty-six candidates, all ninth graders, turned out at the start of practice, Turner said, but the roster since then has been peeled down to 30. The squad will be pared still more during the next week but the Junior High coach pointed out he is in no particular hurry to do so, as he wishes to give every boy a chance to prove his ability. The final complement will consist of from 20-25 boys.

"We're not out to set the world on fire here at Junior High," Turner said, "but merely to provide some experience for the boys so they won't be cold when they hit Senior High."

In this respect, three of Turner's boys from last year's Papoosees are showing signs of future promise in Indian varsity ranks, Frank Olson, Dale Blank and Kee Briggs are in Newby's starting 12 this season, each a product of Turner's tutelage last year.

Tournament Slated
A tournament will be held at Ashland early in March, with Klamath Falls, Grants Pass, Ashland and Roseburg Papoosees participating. Although Medford is in the regular league, they turned down a bid to appear in last year's tourney, and Klamath Falls, a member of the Southern Oregon League, will participate instead, Turner said.

Ed Wyatt, eighth grader athlete coach at Junior High, will assist Turner during the current season.

Woodcock Gets Boosed Decision Over Lee Savold

LONDON, Dec. 7 — (AP) — Bruce Woodcock won the fight but lost the big prize—any hope for a world title match with heavyweight boxing champion Joe Louis.

Lee Savold lost the bout but showed himself a better man and worthier foe for Louis than the winner.

That sums up the slant of expert ringiders on the scheduled 10-round go here last night that had been plugged as an elimination for a world championship contest.

Woodcock, the British heavyweight champion, was a pronounced winner in the fourth round when the referee disqualified Savold on the grounds he had hit below the belt.

Savold, from Paterson, N. J., was going strong at the time and many onlookers had been expecting him to win.

Boos at the decision went up from among the crowd of 11,000 in the arena while Woodcock writhed and mugged on the canvas in a show of pain.

London fight writers took exception to the outcome in this morning's papers, and almost to a man they agreed Woodcock is not championship material.

PORTLAND, Dec. 7 — (AP) — The new fish law banning use of drag and whip seines, traps and other fixed gear for salmon in Oregon waters is now in effect.

Master fish warden Suomela said the law approved by electors in an initiative vote Nov. 2 became effective Dec. 2 by governor's proclamation.

Indian fishing rights protected by federal treaties are exempt, Suomela explained.
