Errol Flynn Faces Charge of Kicking N. Y. Policeman

NEW YORK, Dec. 8. (AP)—A bench warrant for arrest of Errol Flynn was issued in magistrate's court Tuesday after the screen actor failed to appear on a charge of kicking a cop in the shin.

An expert boxer and fencer, the 38-year-old actor allegedly gave the boot to one of New York's finest after one of those cloudy disputes that sometimes befall gentlemen in taxis after midnight.

Flynn, released in \$500 bail supplied by a night club proprietor, hollered it was a "frameup." The validity of what happened to whom was to be tested in court later today.

This was the police version of the incident:

Flynn and a companion who identified himself as Robert Graham Wahn, 38, a movie publicity writer, were riding in a

taxi which was stopped by a police patrol car.

The police—Patrolmen Joseph Bergeles and Joseph Cardover—thought the 22-year-old driver had an unusually youthful appearance.

When the driver got out to show his credentials, Wahn leaped out and allegedly used abusive language.

Flynn, a man of hair-trigger temperament, sat quietly in the car.

Then everyone was taken to a police station.

There, with one word leading to another, Bergeles charged that Flynn kicked him in the shin as the policeman walked behind him.

Flynn and Wahn were removed to another station which has cells. Flynn was charged with third degree assault, Wahn with disorderly conduct.

Anti-Communist Chosen Mayor Of Blockaded Berlin

BERLIN, Dec. 8. (AP)—An outspoken foe of Communism, Socialist Ernst Reuter, became lord mayor of blockaded and sunken Berlin today. The newly elected city assembly chose him unanimously to finish the present mayoral term, in expectation that he would be continued in office when the assembly meets in January.

The Russians, who have a rump Communist city government in their occupation zone, do not recognize Reuter. His sway is over the three western zones of about half the area of Berlin and more than 2,000,000 people.

The new mayor will replace Acting Mayor Louise Schroeder, also a socialist, who reverts to deputy mayor. A Russian veto prevented Reuter, a reformed Communist, from taking office last year.

The east-west conflict split the administrative staff of the city's power company.

Gen. Lucius D. Clay, U. S. military governor, said an average of 1,000 Germans are fleeing Russian rule every day and slipping into the western zones.

Refugee Says Russians 70 Pct. Anti-Communist

WIESBADEN, Germany, Dec. 8. (AP)—Two Russian air force fliers who fled the Soviet Union said yesterday they believe war between Russia and the United States is inevitable.

The fliers, Lieut. Peter A. Paragov, 28, and Anatoly P. Barsov, 31, landed in Austria Oct. 9 and came here as "guests" of U. S. Airforce Headquarters in Europe. They said the Red armed forces are wracked with dissatisfaction and could not win against the United States. They said 70 percent of the Russian people hate the Communist regime.

"But due to fear, they don't do anything about it," said Paragov, a former navigator.

Turkey Men Plan To Enlarge Flocks

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 8.—Despite skyrocketing prices for market birds, indications Tuesday were that Oregon producers still plan to hold back around 230,000 turkey hens in breeding flocks, about 30 per cent more than a year ago.

Trade reports indicated that some growers, tempted by the unprecedented 65-cent market price and profits of around \$5 a bird, were thinking about marketing part of the hens intended for egg production.

Prospects for a good egg demand and a normal hatching season, however, were expected to induce most growers to carry out earlier plans for stepping up breeding flocks.

Egg prices to growers were reported at 35 cents an egg, about the same as last year. Several flocks were in production this week, and the first settings were due to go into the incubator next week.

Reports from California were that about 500,000 hens would be held for laying, a drop from the

700,000 indicated earlier but still 60 per cent above last year.
