

Jobless Payments May Exceed Last Year Totals

SALEM, Dec. 10.—(AP)—Payments to Oregon's unemployed in November were less than a year ago.

But the Unemployment Compensation Commission said it fears that a flood of new claims filed in the past two weeks would push benefit payments above last year's totals.

Total payments in November were \$704,932, compared with \$846,826 in November, 1947. Payments to unemployed civilians totaled \$535,365, or 1.6 per cent more than the previous year. Unemployed war veterans received \$229,567, which was 28.1 per cent less than in November, 1947.

The Commission said the big increase in claims was caused by shutdown of many lumber and logging plants, plus the usual above last year's totals.

Austrian Official Gets Soviet Penalty as Spy

VIENNA, Austria, Dec. 10.—(AP)—Austrian government sources said yesterday Dr. Margarethe Ottlinger, government official, has been sentenced to 20 years hard labor by a Soviet military court on charges of spying against Russian occupation authorities.

The 30-year-old section chief of the Austrian ministry of economic planning was arrested by Russian troops Nov. 5.

The Soviet News Agency Tass said at the same time that Dr. Ottlinger had confessed the United States hired her as a spy. U. S. Army headquarters denied the charge.

Screen Writer Found Hanging on His Yacht

NEWPORT BEACH, Calif., Dec. 10.—(AP)—The body of Wilfred Pettitt, well-known Hollywood writer, was found, zodiac day, police reported, hanging aboard his yacht, "Gay Lady." He was 38 and a native of Liverpool, England.

Detective D. R. Bursdall said his preliminary investigation

ruled out murder, pending an autopsy.

Pettitt, who wrote the screenplay for "The Swordsman," only recently returned for the holidays from New York, where he was working on the stage play, "Devils Carnival."

Portlander in Greece Believed Kidnapped

ATHENS, Dec. 10.—(AP)—American officials said today they believed Greek guerrillas kidnapped Carl A. Gaessner, 45, of Portland, Ore.

Another American, Francis L. McShane, was abducted last month but released.

Gaessner, an equipment supervisor for Atkinson, Drake & Park, contractors, and a Greek interpreter disappeared Wednesday on a trip from Kozane to Servia to inspect American road building equipment. The burned ruins of a pickup truck his party was using was found along the highway.

The yearling, "Blackears," won first prize at the last two county fairs, and Glen was grooming her for entry this year as a heifer.

Another valuable yearling, owned by Glen's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Wagner, was shot and killed the same evening.
