LONDON, Dec. 11 — (AP) — Winston Churchill urged Britain yesterday to end her "silly boycott" of the new state of Israel.

The wartime prime minister also told the House of Commons in a foreign affairs debate:

1. Attempts should be made to end the East-West cold war and reach a settlement with Russia "before they have the atomic bomb as well as the Americans."

2. Britain should achieve full diplomatic relations with Franco Spain "as soon as we can obtain the sanction of the United Nations."

Churchill told the House it should realize that Israel had beaten the Arabs in Palestine and added:

"Send your envoys to Tel Aviv without delay, and as soon as you can obtain sanctions from the United Nations, send them (British envoys) back to Madrid."

Churchill disclosed that in 1945, 10 days before the European war ended, he sent a personal letter to Prime Minister Stalin of Russia, warning that any East-West quarrel would "tear the world to pieces." He read the letter to the House, saying it marked "the highest point in my relations with Stalin."

Churchill devoted much of his 70-minute speech to praising the continuing development of British-American unity.

He won loud cheers for his warm praise of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower as a man who "labored faithfully for the cause of Anglo-American amity and brotherhood throughout the world."

Fish Department Men Return from Portland

James Vaughn, superintendent of the state game department trout hatchery on Rock Creek; Ross Newcomb, biologist in charge of the Umpqua River study; and Henry Martin, assistant biologist, returned Friday from Portland where they attended a three-day conference of hatchery superintendents and field agents. The meeting was held, it was stated, for a general study of fish hatchery operations and to plan future activities.

Reclamation Road Funds are Asked

WASHINGTON, Dec. 11 — (AP) — State Senator John H. Robertson of Creston, Wash., has asked the Reclamation Bureau to tell him as soon as possible how much aid it can give his state in building roads on reclamation projects.

The Senator told a reporter just before leaving for home that as a follow-up to conferences with Reclamation Commissioner Michael W. Strauss he had written him to submit the data in time to submit it to the Washington State Senator when it convenes next month.

Robertson said he wants figures for roads on both old and new reclamation projects.

He was here a week discussing with Strauss and others the commissioner's proposal that the reclamation law be amended so the government can pay outright its share for roads on new reclamation projects. In his letter, Robertson asked for a written outline of the plan.

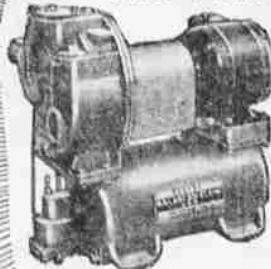

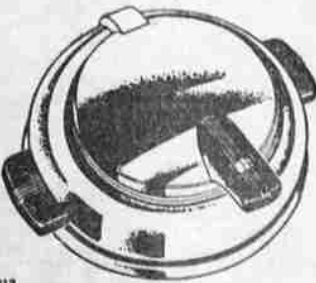
