Poultry Co-Op To Build Warehouse In South Drain

Construction of a \$7,500 warehouse and receiving station in South Drain by the Pacific Co-operative Producers, to serve its members in North Douglas County, was reported by the Drain Enterprise this week.

Eggs will be received at the warehouse for shipment to the association's grading and packing plant in Eugene, while feeds will be shipped in from the association's mill at Eugene for distribution to poultrymen in the Drain area.

Known as the Pacific Co-op, the association is a statewide organization which has served poultrymen for the past 28 years.

In commenting on the Co-op's investment in North Douglas County, Grover C. Keeney, general manager, said that the poultry business will continue to be one of Oregon's fastest-growing industries in the next few years and the bulk of growth will be in the southwestern portion of the state, as the postwar lumbering boom levels off.

"Oregon's income last year from the poultry business was \$20,000,000," he said, "yet Oregon is now consuming more eggs than it produces."

Keeney said he looks for a swift comeback in the poultry business in North Douglas County, which he said he believes is one of the best for the purpose in the state. He said Yoncalla formerly led the state in turkey production and that local flocks there are again being built up.

The Pacific Co-op first established a part-time station at Drain in May, 1942, with Rufus Pfister as local manager. The new station now being constructed will be a 32x60-foot building, covered with aluminum, with a 40-foot long loading dock covered with an eight-foot marquee.

Relief Ship Plan May Face Strike

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 10.—(AP)—The AFL Sailors Union of the Pacific threatened today to tie up foreign ships carrying Marshall Plan cargo if the Economic Cooperation Administration stops shipping of bulk relief cargo in American vessels.

Wednesday Paul G. Hoffman, ECA head, announced he would end a policy of carrying half of all such cargo in American bottoms beginning Jan. 1, because of higher freight costs.

SUP Executive Secretary Harry Lundberg's threat followed a protest yesterday by the Pacific American Steamship Association and another by Capt. John A. Cron, secretary-treasurer of the AFL Masters, Mates and Pilots Association, West Coast division.

Lundberg telegraphed Hoffman asserting the ECA chief was exceeding his authority and said: "We intend to use all our power, including economic power, to see that American ships receive 50 percent of the relief cargo."

Lundberg said that by economic power he meant "we will put pickets around every foreign ship carrying Marshall Plan cargoes."

Processors Shift Blame For Contaminated Prunes

PORTLAND, Dec. 11.—(AP)—Government attorneys yesterday recommended in federal court, that Hudson-Duncan & Co., Portland grocery and food-processing firm, be fined \$2,500 on a charge of shipping contaminated prunes in interstate commerce.

Judge Claude McCulloch said he would make further study of the recommendations and the company's statement that it has altered its purchasing policy. The company said the prunes were from a hold-over crop and had been in storage since the previous year's harvest while in growers' hands. In the future, only the current year's needs will be bought, a company representative said.

The shipment occurred in 1947 from Dundee to Tacoma.

Government attorneys said the company was fined \$750 on each of two counts involving contaminated cherries last year, and for that reason the larger fine was recommended.

Marshall Plan Has O. K. Of Methodist Board

BUCK HILLS FALLS, Pa., Dec. 11.—(AP)—The Board of Missions and Church Extensions of the Methodist Church yesterday unanimously endorsed continuation of the Marshall Plan provided it does not become a "military lend-lease program for the rearming of Western Europe."

In other actions ending a four-day convocation the board:

1. Adopted a \$10,335,326 budget for the year beginning June 1, 1949. It is the largest budget ever set by the board.
2. Urged continuance of negotiations between Russia and the United States "on all possible levels looking toward establishment of peace treaties and easing of tensions in central Europe and the Far East."
3. Reaffirmed the "historic policies of Methodism" to continue missionary work in China regardless of possible danger.
4. Endorsed President Truman's decision to ask the 81st Congress to provide \$16,000,000 for relief of Arab refugees.
