financial embarrassment has reached a new high, with creditors threatening to cut off deliveries of even such small supplies as stationery.

Sundborg, who is consultant for the Alaska Development Board, plans to fly to Nome. There he will review with the northwest Alaska Chamber of Commerce the preliminary draft of a report on economic opportunities of northwest Alaska compiled by Ralph Browne for the development board.

Governor Gruening's assistant said there is a territorial general fund deficit of \$720,000 as of Friday.

He said about 1,200 unpaid claims are being held by the auditor's office for lack of funds. Some claims, such as those on the teachers' retirement fund, are more than a year old.

Sundborg said the general fund had \$70,000 in it as of Friday. This is being held up to meet the Dec. 31 payroll which amounts to \$120,000.

He said he hoped forthcoming tax collections would make up the payroll shortage.
