Real Estate Loans In Western States Tumble

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 16 — (AP) — Real estate loans, which had climbed to successive weekly peaks for a year and a half with three exceptions, tumbled \$2,000,000 in the far west for the week ended Dec. 8.

The Federal Reserve Bank here yesterday reported the total for the 12th district at \$2,080,000,000. This was \$2,000,000 under the peak recorded in the week ended Nov. 24.

These loans declined for the weeks of July 7 and Aug. 4 and were unchanged for the week ended Dec. 1. Otherwise they have soared weekly since July, 1947, when the bank started the current series of reports.

The current total is \$278,000,000 above a year ago.
