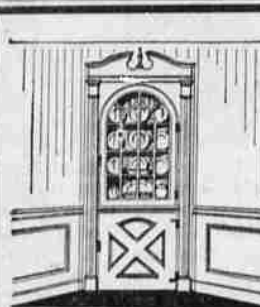

DAR LEADER DIES
MEDFORD, Ore., Dec. 17.—(AP)—Mrs. Bert B. Lowry, 64, a long-time leader in the Oregon Daughters of the American Revolution, died unexpectedly here Wednesday.

She was Medford regent of the DAR in 1938-39 and state regent for the 1944-46 term. A native of Laoma, Mo., she was married at Hood River in 1910 to Mr. Lowry and they came here in 1912. The widower, five sons and a daughter survive. Funeral services will be held Monday.

Pear Growers Will Get Government Subsidy

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—(AP)—A subsidy program designed to increase domestic consumption and exports of some varieties of winter pears produced in Oregon, Washington and California was announced yesterday by the Agriculture Department.

Payments of 45 cents a box will be made to shippers for pears exported to countries participating in the European Recovery Program and for pears diverted from normal trade channels to markets in these states:

North and South Dakota, Minnesota, Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Texas, Louisiana, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Georgia, South and North Carolina.

Varieties included in the program are Beurre D'Anjou, Fall Russet, Bose, Winter Nellis and Doyenne Du Comice. The subsidy will be paid only on pears of U. S. No. 2 grade or better.

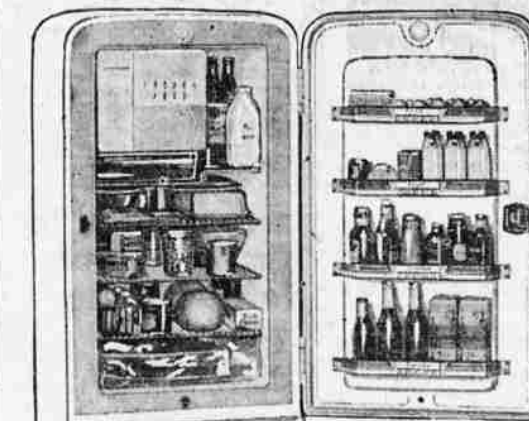

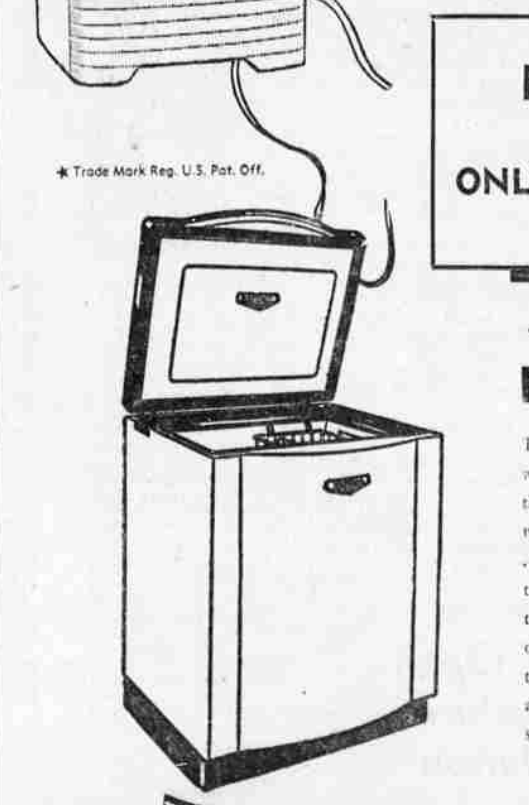
