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Anti-Trust Suit Hits Rubber Firms

CLEVELAND, Dec. 17.—(AP)—U. S. Attorney General Tom C. Clark yesterday filed a civil anti-trust suit against three major American and English rubber firms on a charge of unlawful cartel agreements.

Named as co-defendants were the United States Rubber Co. of New York; Consol. Rubber Manufacturers, Ltd., of London; and Dunlop Rubber Co., Ltd., of London.

The suit charged the companies with controlling American rubber and latex imports and exports by maintaining "territory" agreements. By the agreements, the accused companies in Europe re-frained from trading in each other's designated territories thus

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eliminating competition, the suit said.
The government said the suit was filed in Federal Court here to help maintain the United States policy against artificial barriers and agreements in domestic and foreign trade and commerce.
The suit asked that the purported restrictive cartel arrangements between the defendants and the conspirators be ended and that they definitely divest themselves of all jointly owned financial interests.

Yukon Wildlife Movie Attracts Capacity Crowd

A capacity audience last night witnessed the showing of James H. Bond's motion picture, "From Out of the Yukon," at the Junior High School Auditorium. It was the second time this picture filled the Auditorium to capacity, as the first public showing a year ago in Roseburg was the beginning of a tour which carried Bond into every principal city in Oregon and into nearly all states in the western half of the country.

Bond, author of the book "From Out of the Yukon," a story dealing with his trip into wilderness area abutting the Arctic Circle on a big game study, prefaced his show last night with an appeal to conservation-minded people to organize behind a program of saving the state's natural resources and to cooperate in the plan to reorganize and finance the state's game department.

Following the picture on his Yukon exploration, Bond showed a trailer dealing with national parks.

Canal Type Financing For Power Units Advised

LONGVIEW, Wash., Dec. 16.—(AP)—A plan similar to that which was used to finance construction of the Panama Canal is needed to finance western power development projects.

This is the suggestion of Samuel Morris, superintendent of the Los Angeles Water and Light Department. It was made to members of the Bonneville Regional Advisory Council here.

Morris said it is possible to finance western power projects by U. S. government revenue bonds, rather than by direct appropriations by Congress. According to Morris, the secretary of the Treasury was authorized to issue bonds for the Panama Canal project and the same type of financing probably could be authorized for projects in the west.

The discussion pointed out that in any case a method is needed for financing which will be more adequate than the present stop-and-go method, particularly for projects which pay their own way.
