

White Man Who Molests Negro Girl Gets 20 Years

TUSCALOOSA, Ala., Dec. 17.—(AP)—A white man was convicted of carnal knowledge of an 11-year-old Negro girl and his punishment fixed at 20 years imprisonment by a circuit court jury here last night.

Floyd Haywood, 40, a painter of nearby Holt, Ala., denied the charge in pleadings but did not take the stand. He also was charged with rape. The jury verdict, returned after an hour's deliberation, did not mention the rape indictment.

Russians Restore Broadcasting In Damaged Station

BERLIN, Dec. 17.—(AP)—Radio Berlin was doing business at the same old stand again today. Russia's most powerful propaganda voice in Germany went back on the air only 12 hours after the French had blown up its giant transmission towers.

Soviet commentator Heinz Schmidt began broadcasting again last night on the same wave length and apparently with the same broadcasting power, even though the station's two tall transmitting towers lay shattered in the French sector.

Radio Berlin's personnel refused to say how they managed it. German engineers said they might be using another tower at Potsdam.

Schmidt declared in his broadcast that an "order from Washington" not the French had been responsible for the dynamiting. Taegliche Rundschau, official

Soviet Army newspaper, hinted at reprisals.

"This barbaric demolition will be entered in future accounts and all necessary conclusions drawn from it," the editor wrote.

Brig. Gen. Jean Ganeval, French commandant in Berlin, said the towers were dynamited because they menaced American air. British airlift planes flying into near-by Tegel airfield.

Watching Child's Birth Costs Two Men \$5,000

BRAINERD, Minn., Dec. 17.—(AP)—Mrs. Lola Ramona Doekter today held a \$5,000 jury verdict against a physician and a layman the doctor allowed to watch the

birth of her child two years ago in a Brainerd hospital.

Jurors returned the verdict against Carl G. Winquist and Bert H. Betters, both of nearby Ironton, where Mrs. Doekter also lives. The woman sued for \$20,000, charging invasion of her privacy because Betters looked on without her consent or approval.

Russian Custody Causes Woman to Change Story

VIENNA, Austria, Dec. 17.—(AP)—U. S. Army investigators report the woman who once said four Russian soldiers slew Irving Ross now tells them—after more than six weeks in Russian custody—that she's can't identify the nationality of the killers.

The woman is Miss Dana Supina, 42, an Austrian.

She herself was severely injured by the uniformed men who stopped Ross' car in the Soviet zone early Sunday morning, Oct. 31, beat him to death with clubbed guns, rifled his billfold, removed the car's wheels and spare tires and headed off in a jeep. She and Ross, 38-year-old ECA official from East Hardwick, Vt., had been driving home from a Saturday night party. She suffered head wounds.

The U. S. Army announced today the Russian ban was relaxed this week. American investigators were permitted to question her Tuesday for the first time.

Fibber M'Gee's 'Molly' Loses \$1,000 Necklace

HOLLYWOOD, Dec. 17.—(AP)—Police were looking today for a missing purse and a \$1,000 necklace belonging to Mrs. Marian Jordan, better known as "Molly" of "Fibber McGee and Molly."

She reported to police that it disappeared from her dressing room at the NBC radio studio.
