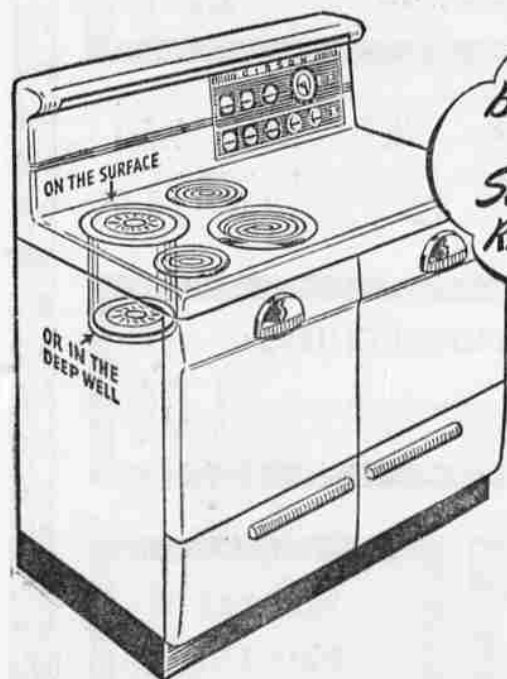

Feather Used in Test Of Twisting Steel Bar

PITTSBURGH, Dec. 21.—(AP)—Westinghouse scientists today rested a feather against a steel bar—and then measured how much the bar was twisted.

The occasion was a demonstration of their newly-developed device to make better torque meters—gadgets that measure power delivered by airplane propellers, jet engines, and other rotating machinery.

The incredibly sensitive device, known as a "twist detector" by its designers, William P. Welch and Benjamin J. Cametti at the Westinghouse research labs here,

will measure a twist of less than one-millionth of an inch.
