### Dismissal Orders Issued In Five Settled Suits

Circuit Judge Carl E. Wimberly, upon filing of motions by attorneys for the plaintiffs, has ordered dismissed the following cases which have been settled out of court:

Douglas County vs. Harvey and Winona Dysert, suit to condemn property for road right-of-way; Charles Polrot vs. Leonard T. Rose, settled in full by payment of \$2321.47 by surety, A. C. Leighton, to the plaintiff. Surety discharged.

William H. Baker, vs. Richard C. and Marian E. Simmons. Writ of attachment dismissed.

State Unemployment Compensation Commission vs. Harold W. Thorp. Claim fully paid and discharged.

H. E. Mowry vs. Warren Barnes and others. Decree for partition and appointment of referees for partition made and entered June 29, 1948, vacated, and plaintiff's complaint dismissed.

### Administrator Named For C. E. Hagar Estate

Edward W. Hager has been named in an order of County Judge D. N. Buehner as administrator of the estate of Charles Edgar Hagar, who died Dec. 3, 1948, at the age of 67 years in Roseburg. He left real property valued at \$10,000 and personal property of a "probable value" of \$50,000. The appointment was made upon petition of Roland G. Hagar, Marian V. Hagar, Clara M. Hagar and Edward W. Hagar, the surviving sons and daughters. Named as appraisers are G. V. Wimberly, Roy Young and Leon McClintock.

The U. S. National Bank of Portland has been named administrator of the estate of Samuel S. Knepley, who died Sept. 30, 1947, in the Veterans Hospital at Roseburg. He left personal property of \$5,000. N. D. Johnson was named appraiser of the estate. Appointment was made upon motion of Martha Knepley Deegan, widow of Martha Knepley Deegan, nee George Luoma.

### Court Transfers Moneys To County General Fund

TOKYO, Dec. 22.—(AP)—The Tokyo newspaper "Yomiuri" reported six more infants died yesterday from injections of faulty anti-diphtheria serum. This would bring total fatalities from the government's immunization program to 66.

## U. S. Files Suit For Control Of Oil-Rich Tideland

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—(AP)—Attorney General Clark yesterday brought actions in the Supreme Court to obtain federal jurisdiction over the oil-rich tidelands off the coasts of Texas and Louisiana.

Clark asked the court to apply to these coastal lands the same finding of federal "paramount" interest which the court gave to the United States in the California tidelands case, decided in June, 1947.

The suit to carry out the announced intention of the Justice department to establish federal jurisdiction over the so-called tidelands where oil is produced from under-water wells.

Millions of dollars are involved in the claims.

If the federal government successfully maintained its claims, at least part of royalties from oil production would go to it rather than to the state governments.

The issue has been a hot one for many years.

Congress in 1946 passed a bill declaring the underwater coastal lands to be the property of the individual states. President Truman vetoed the bill however, because of the then-pending California case.

The National Association of State Attorneys General subsequently sponsored a similar new bill in the present Congress. It was passed by the House, but died on the Senate calendar.

Some lawyers argue that the California decision would not necessarily hold good as to Texas and Louisiana because of differences in the way those states came into the union.

Clark told the supreme court yesterday that the conditions under which Louisiana became a part of the union "are similar in all respects to those under which California became a state," and that the California decision should apply there automatically.

He said that Texas came into the union under different circumstances but that "to the extent that any of those differences are relevant at all, they point even more clearly to paramount rights (in the off-shore property) in the United States."

The attorney general has several times stated that the move to obtain the oil royalties in the tidelands for the federal govern-

ment does not in any way disturb state control over the taking of fish in the marginal sea.

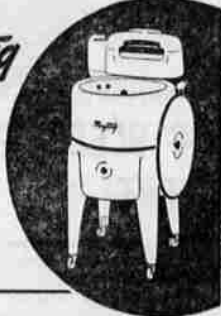
